

The Warrenville Park District's total FY25 annual budget is approximately \$4 million dollars of which approximately 65% is funded by property tax revenue. The remaining 35% is generated through program user fees, grants and rentals.


The graph below shows how your tax bill is allocated amongst the various taxing district in Warrenville.





Awarded an Illinois Arts Council/National Endowment for the Arts (IAC/NEA I) **Grant** for 2024-25 in the amount of \$6,650

Introduced Sensory Bags available at our facilities aimed to **enhance the experience for individuals** who may benefit from a quieter, more focused moment during their visit.

Warrenville Multicultural Festival was held in June to offer a unique platform for **people from various backgrounds to come together** and share their traditions, stories, and art forms

Awarded \$2,436.00 in scholarships to those in need of financial assistance

In partnership with Western DuPage Special Recreation Association (WDSRA), provided **45 program participants with inclusion aides**

F425 Projects

Cerny Park Improvement Project - The City of Warrenville, in partnership with the Warrenville Park District, is leading a planning initiative to complete park improvements at Cerny Park and apply for funding assistance through an OSLAD (Open Space and Land Acquisition Development) grant from the IDNR (IL Department of Natural Resources).

Lions Park Playground Basketball Court Project - Resurfaced and color coating applied, and installed new hoops

The Recreation Center **Parking Lot Project** - Repaired sidewalks, and grinding and repaving of the parking lot

Exterior Door Access Project - Project designed to improve building and property security by automating District building doors opening and closing schedules, along with tracking and controlling building access.

Recreation Center Door 1 - Awning installed to aid in the reduction of ice buildup



Upcoming F426 Projects

Cerny Park Improvement Project - The City of Warrenville, in partnership with the Warrenville Park District, is leading a planning initiative to complete park improvements at Cerny Park and apply for funding assistance through an OSLAD (Open Space and Land Acquisition Development) grant from the IDNR (IL Department of Natural Resources).

Sesqui Park Improvement Project - Fencing, Basketball Court resurfacing and installation of Pickleball Courts

The Recreation Center **Gym Project** - Installation of new basketball panels and basketball scorer's table

Equipment Project - Purchase of Scissor lift, ball machine, replacement pick-up truck and 3 new spin bikes.

Recreation Center Lobby / Warrenville Community Building - Purchase of new lobby display racks to have a cohesive design with bulletin boards
